\_\_\_\_\_ **Committee for Diversity and Inclusion (CDI)**. The purpose of the CDI shall be to promote principles of diversity and inclusion as set out in the Bar's Anti-Discrimination Policy, and implement or continue programs designed to increase the diversity of the Bar's membership and the local legal community.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Elder Law Affairs Committee** addresses the needs of the elderly such as crimes against the elderly, Alzheimer's, access to the Courts and educating the elderly. Also hosts a CLE seminar for members of the Bar on elder law issues.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Guardianship Education Committee** staffs guardianship education classes required for all guardians to attend. The committee also works with the judiciary in reviewing the contents of the classes.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Judicial Relations Committee** serves as a liaison between the Bar and the Judiciary; plans, implements and coordinates programs for better understanding and relations between the Bench and Bar including the bi-annual judicial evaluation, lunches with the judiciary and the annual Bench/Bar Conference. (limited to 50 members)

\_\_\_\_\_ **Law Related Education Committee** works to promote effective community, law related education programs, for adults and students in Palm Beach County, with an emphasis on respect for the legal system and civics education. The committee seeks to maintain and enhance the cooperative efforts of attorneys and educators in the field of law related education in Palm Beach County. This committee may include ex officio members who are not members of the Bar, but have an interest in promoting the committee's goals and objectives.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Law Week Committee** plans, organizes, promotes and coordinates the activities of Law Week 2019. These programs include conducting mock trials in the schools, shadow a judge program, as well as providing various opportunities for the public such as free legal clinics and dial-a-lawyer programs.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Lawyers for Literacy Committee** works on programs to raise awareness in the community about illiteracy.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Local Government & Land Use Committee** will be made up of city, county and other local government lawyers practicing land use law and private sector attorneys representing and practicing before local governments and agencies. The committee will provide relevant CLE's and networking opportunities.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Lawyer Referral Program Committee** will serve as an advisory committee to the operations of the bar's lawyer referral service program.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Membership Committee** works to retain members and recruit new members to the organization, including planning membership events, preparing member highlight articles for the Bulletin and periodically selecting a You've Been Served recognition recipient, which is designed to highlight the positive community services provided by PBCBA lawyers.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Paralegal Committee** provides continuing legal education and ethical programs for the advancement of and incoming and established paralegals.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Professionalism Committee** addresses ways to foster professionalism in and among Bar members; responds to negative publicity concerning the legal profession; reviews complaints referred to the Professionalism Council; works with many of the Bar's other committees to assist in incorporating a professionalism component to their programming; and oversees the annual Professionalism Award given to an individual attorney or organization. (limited to 50 members)

\_\_\_\_\_ **Small Claims Court Clinics Committee** presents monthly clinics for the public on small claims court procedures at locations throughout the county. Participants must have recent experience in small claims court matters in order to participate on this committee.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Solo & Small Firm Practitioner's Committee** provides an opportunity for small firm & solo practitioners to meet and network in an informal setting such as brown bag lunch meetings and happy hours to exchange information and assist each other with office practices and procedures.
