



Palm Beach County Bar Association Sidney A. Stubbs Professionalism Award

The importance of promoting professionalism and ethical conduct has been recognized by local bar associations and state bar organizations all over the country, as well as the American Bar Association. The stated mission of the Palm Beach County Bar Association is to serve its members, foster professionalism, and enhance the public's understanding and awareness of the legal system.

For the last twenty-four years, the Palm Beach County Bar Association's Professionalism Committee has worked to emphasize and promote the importance of professionalism issues on a local level through education, awareness, and deterrence. A Professionalism Panel has been created that hears referrals made by an attorney or judge who believes that another attorney's conduct violated the Florida Bar's Ideals of Professional Conduct and the Palm Beach County Bar's Standards of Professional Guidelines.

To recognize and reward those who exemplify professionalism, the Palm Beach County Bar Association will present its Twenty-Fourth Annual Professionalism Award during the Bench Bar Conference scheduled for March 10, 2023.

Selection Criteria: The Sidney A. Stubbs Professionalism Award recognizes an attorney that has demonstrated or promoted outstanding professionalism in Palm Beach County, as defined by exemplary ethical conduct, character and integrity, respect for the legal system and all of its participants, commitment to maintaining the highest levels of professional competence, courtesy and civility, and commitment to serving clients, the community and the public good.
